



- (6) Awareness
- (7) Multiculturalism

#### Unintended Consequences

Used holidays to teach about cultures

Tourist curriculum encouraged stereotypes

Emphasized nationalities or ethnicities

Lost sight of individual children

#### Melting Pot vs Salad Bowl

Melting Pot: Everyone loses their identity in favor of an emerging national character "A Gray Crayon"

 Salad Bowl/Mosaic: Mixtures of various ingredients that keep their individual characteristics

#### Key Challenges

- What support can be given to caregivers in helping them deal with the effects of violence in their children's lives?
- How can we best listen to the voices of young children and help them to explore, in a safe environment, their experiences of conflict and beliefs, fears, and anxieties that arise from these?

#### Key Challenges, ctd.

- In situations where there are high and intense levels of violence, how do we go about meeting the needs of children when their families and communities are literally disintegrating?
- How can we begin to work effectively with families and communities experiencing violence and armed conflict?

#### Key Challenges, ctd

- How can we be effective advocates for children living in conflict affected societies?
- What role can we, as people who care about children, play in terms of helping to build the peace?






